- **Crisis Response, Issues Management and Reputation Recovery**

The fellowship will provide you with a practical understanding of public affairs, including networking and mentorship opportunities, support with job applications and other measures to assist you in entering the job market.

The program is designed to accommodate the busy schedules of students, with one 90-minute evening seminar each week and all coursework to be done in class.

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It appealed to me, in particular, because of how relevant it was to the work I do at the Ontario Public Service.

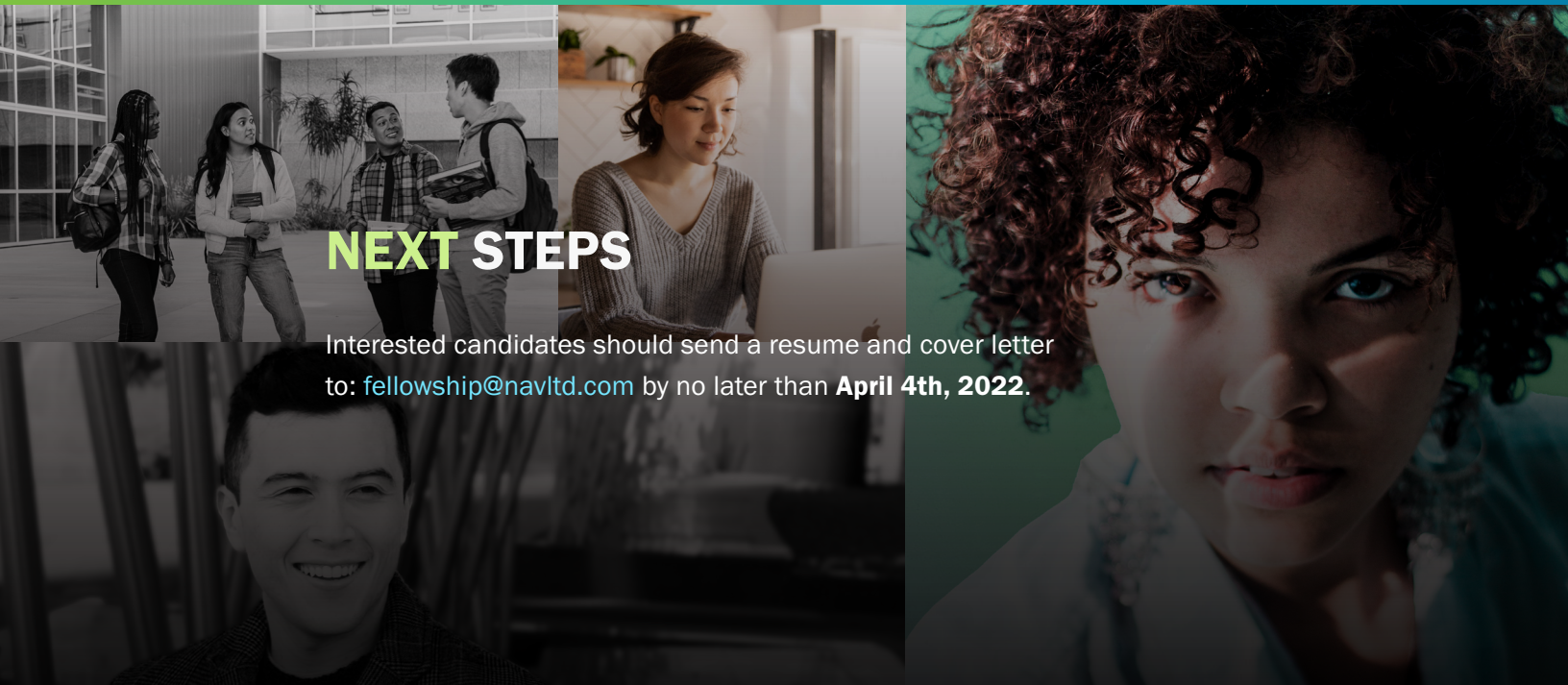
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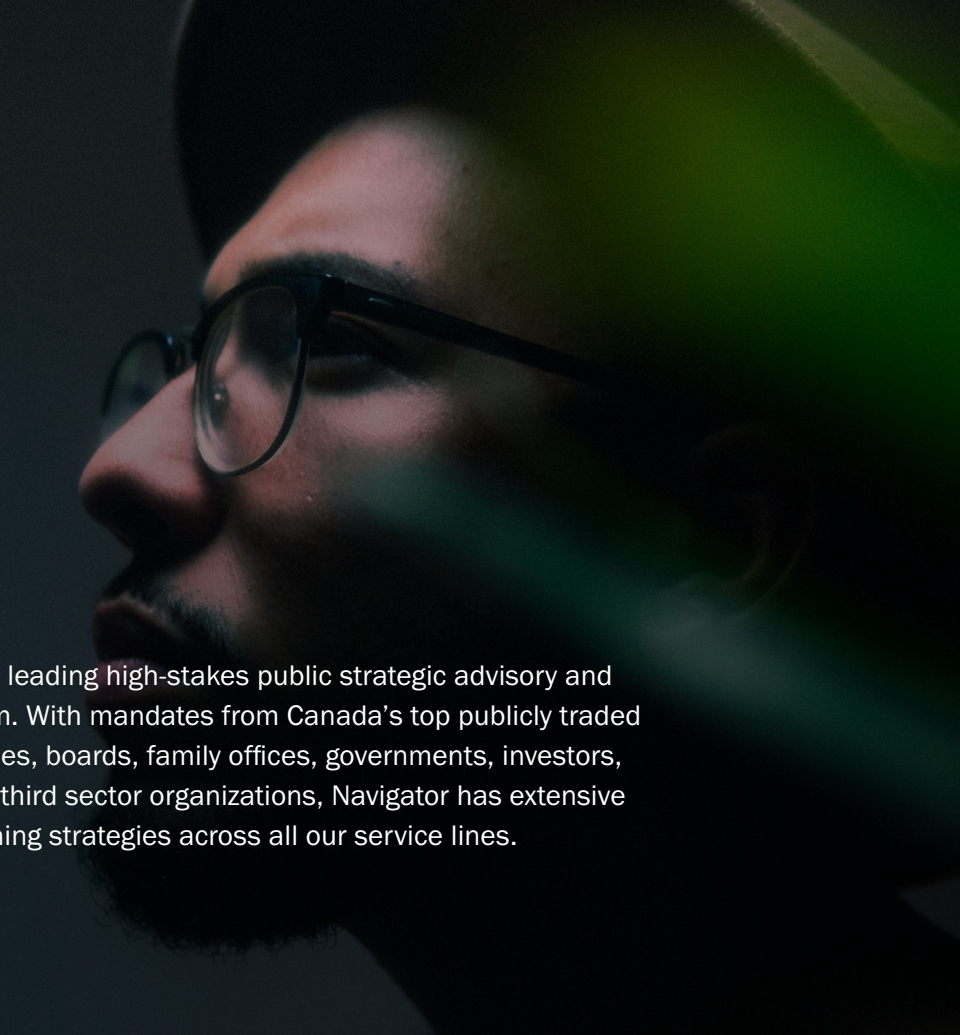
CANDIDATE REQUIREMENTS
